PUTNAM COUNTY EMERGENCY RESOLUTION NO. 2024-112

RESCINDING MANDATORY CURFEW DURING THE DECLARED STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR HURRICANE MILTON

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order 24-215, dated October 5th, 2024, declaring a state of emergency for Putnam County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 24-215, in accordance with Section 252.38, Florida Statutes, authorizes political subdivisions to take whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Putnam County, Florida, issued a Resolution 2024-110 declaring a state of local emergency, dated October 7th, 2024; and

WHEREAS, on October 10th, 2024, Putnam County imposed a mandatory curfew from 8 pm to 6 am due to the dangerous and lifethreatening conditions incurred by the passing of Hurricane Milton.

WHEREAS, previous power service outages, road blockage, and other identified storm hazards in Putnam County have been minimized and abated by the diligent work of its utility workers, emergency personnel, and law enforcement.

WHEREAS, the Putnam County Sheriff, based on current storm damage reporting recommended lifting the emergency curfew within the geographic boundaries of Putnam County.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered:

All previously imposed curfew conditions are no longer necessary and are hereby rescinded this October 11th, 2024.
